Intent

Implementation

High-Quality Literary Texts: We carefully select literary texts that align with pupils'
interests while also challenging their comprehension abilities. Our reading lists
incorporate classics, contemporary literature, and diverse authors to widen horizons
and foster empathy.

- Engaging Pedagogical Strategies: We employ a range of teaching strategies, including direct instruction, shared reading, and interactive lessons based on metacognitive principles. We emphasise collaborative learning through group discussions, peer feedback, and drama activities, allowing students to articulate their understanding and learn from one another.
- Integrated Skills Development: Our curriculum integrates reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills across all year groups. For example, writing tasks will often be linked to the texts being studied, helping students to apply their reading skills in practical, creative writing scenarios.
- Regular Assessment and Feedback: We implement ongoing formative assessments

 structured conversations helps to guide students in their learning journeys. We
 celebrate successes and utilise areas for development as springboards for further
 improvement.
- **Professional Development**: We invest in continuous professional development for our teaching staff, ensuring they are well-trained in the latest pedagogical methods and have a thorough understanding of the national curriculum and Ofsted expectations.

Impact

- **Lifelong Learners**: We foster a community of lifelong learners who readily engage with literature outside the classroom. Library logs and home reading records show increased borrowing and reading for pleasure among pupils.
- **Positive Behaviour and Confidence**: Increased participation in class discussions and public speaking opportunities, such as storytelling and presentations, reflect growing

confidence and a positive attitude towards English, which contributes to a cohesive learning environment.
