Learning Focus

It's important to pay attention to the national assessments our children will be participating in. Every year, students have mandatory assessments set by the government. Starting off in Reception, children will complete the baseline assessment, which helps us measure their progress alongside the Good Level of Development by the end of the year. Come Year 1, they'll tackle the phonics screening check in June, where they read a mix of 'real' and 'monster' words to demonstrate their phonics knowledge.

In Year 4, they will take the National Multiplication Check—an online test focusing on their times tables, which they should confidently recite up to 12 x 12.

Finally, Year 6 students will sit their SATs in May, assessing their skills in reading, writing, and maths. Don't worry, we're here to support them every step of the way!
