STAGE 1 - Verbal Warning

STAGE 2 - Turn card to YELLOW

STAGE 3 - Turn card to RED

PLEASE NOTE – <u>some</u>
<u>behaviours will automatically</u>
<u>warrant a Yellow or a red card</u>
<u>and miss certain stages</u>.

If your child receives a RED card they will remain behind after school for 5 minutes and be given a letter home to inform YOU of their behaviour. Consequences differ depending on the behaviour, age of child and context.

Children's RED CARD behaviour is recorded under A,B,C, & D as follows below.

Antecedent (A) What happened before	Behaviour (B)	Consequence (C)	Desirable Outcome (D) What we'd like to see happen
Change of timetable	Refusing to work	Red Card – work in a different classroom	Listen to teacher and join in all activities
Lunchtime games	Rude to others	(already has a yellow for similar behaviour at morning play) Red Card – write a letter of apology	Reminded of school rules and apology.

The RED CARD book is regularly monitored by the Lead Behaviour Teacher (Mr Allen) and Miss Williams (Head teacher) – who are both part of the Senior Management Team

- If a child is consistently appearing in the RED CARD book a behaviour contract may be deemed necessary. Therefore a meeting will be held with parents and member of the Senior Management Team
- If a child on a contract receives 2 RED CARDS within a half term then another meeting will be held with parents and the Senior Management Team.

This may result in an internal exclusion or temporary exclusion.
