Good to be Green – Assertive discipline

Mrs Ince is Breakfast Club Manager and Miss Boyle After School Club Manager. Miss Boyle and Miss Bretherton are part of the school Behaviour Team.

The 4 Step Approach to Consequences for undesirable behaviour:

Step 1 – Give a clear, simple instruction
Step 2 – Give an assertive reminder – give the child time to comply.
Step 3 – Choice & consequence – 'You now have a choice. If you choose to follow my instruction, that's the right choice. However, if you choose not to follow my instruction, the consequence will be....'
Step 4 – Implement the consequence.

Good to be Green Stages:

STAGE 1 – Verbal Warning

STAGE 2 – YELLOW card

STAGE 3 – Red card

PLEASE NOTE – <u>Some behaviours will automatically warrant a Yellow or a Red</u> <u>card and miss certain stages</u>. Any act of physical violence or homophobic or racist language automatically receives a Red card.

If your child receives a RED card they will be given a letter home to inform YOU of their behaviour. Consequences differ depending on the behaviour, age of child and context.

Children who continually receive Yellow cards or receive a RED card in OOS Club will have their place reviewed.

If a child receives a RED card in the school day or breakfast club they will be unable to attend after school club on that day. Parents will be telephoned and asked to make alternative arrangements for pick up. If a child receives a RED card in after school club they will miss their next OOS club session and an appropriate sanction will occur in the next school day.

Children's RED CARD behaviour is recorded under **A,B,C, & D** as follows below.

Antecedent (A) What happened before	Behaviour (B)	Consequence (C)	Desirable Outcome (D) What we'd like to see happen
Change of timetable	Refusing to work with others	Red Card – work in a different area of club	Listen to staff and join in all activities
Outdoor games	Rude to others	(Already has a yellow for similar behaviour inside) Red Card – write a letter of apology	Reminded of school rules and apology.

- The RED CARD book is regularly monitored by the Behaviour Team and Senior Leadership Team.
- If a child is consistently appearing in the RED CARD book a behaviour contract may be deemed necessary. Therefore a meeting will be held with parents and member of the Senior Leadership Team
- If a child on a contract receives 2 RED CARDS within a half term then another meeting will be held with parents and the Senior Leadership Team. This may result in an internal exclusion or temporary exclusion.
