Learning Focus

With it being Science Week this week, we thought we'd bring you up to speed with all the exciting things the children are exploring in Science this term!

Our <u>Nursery</u> children are having a whale of a time naming different animals in various environments and discovering where these creatures make their homes. Meanwhile, <u>Reception</u> are busy classifying animals by the number of legs they have – can you guess which ones have two and which ones have four? They're also learning to match adult animals with their adorable offspring!

In <u>Year 1</u>, the focus is on humans and their senses, alongside the importance of a balanced diet. <u>Year 2</u> are diving into the concept of habitats, understanding how these environments support different plants and animals.

Over in <u>Years 3 and 4</u>, the pupils are delving into light, investigating reflections and what we need to see. Lastly, <u>Y5 and Y6</u> are researching the great Carl Linnaeus and preparing to use classification keys to som organisms.
